A Note from Our Pastor:

Last Sunday, 18 August, I preached on *Standing Up for Jesus!* In a world that dictates its own morals and values, it is not easy to keep and stand up for Christian Values. Someone said that Character is how we act when no one is looking. Unfortunately, we often find it difficult to distinguish between character and reputation. But our character is more important than our reputation as people can damage our reputation, but they cannot damage our reputation.

"Yale law professor Stephen Carter defines character (he calls it integrity) as something very specific, and it requires three steps: (a) discerning what is right and wrong; (b) acting on what you have discerned, even at personal cost; and (c) saying openly that you are acting on your understanding of right from wrong." (1)

If we have character, then we should not be ashamed of our deep convictions nor afraid to live them. Standing Up for Jesus requires us to have Christ's standards as to how we live, act and believe. In our society that seemingly have none of them, we must be willing to set an example that everyone can see that we are different. Christ gives us the best way to live that leads to eternity, but in this day and time it is not very popular.

Psalm 15 asks several questions: "Lord, who may dwell your tent? Who may live on your holy mountain? (v. 1) Then what follows is a description of what God accepts and who is pleasing to Him.

First: Is a person that speaks the truth and walks blameless before the Lord. (vs. 2-3) He or she speaks the truth no matter how it diminishes us, hurts our reputation (according to society) or is painful, because we are ostracized from society. A person of truth speaks the truth no matter if it accuses them of a crime.

Second: A person of character and integrity honors friendships and says no evil about a friend or shares gossip. To find out who your friends are all you have to do is make one public mistake and you will find out.

Third: A person of character keeps their commitments whether their commitment is verbal or contractual.

Fourth: A person of character never takes advantage of others, especially if we can profit from their mistake.

The question we need to ask ourselves is would Christ be pleased with our character and integrity or do we bring shame on our Christian values, we say we adhere? We need to be Christ's examples and model how He would have us live so others can see Jesus in us and that we stand for different values that Christ taught us.






